

The Warm-Up Rules

Home team provides the ball. 2033 and 2032 play with a 28.5 ball. If neither team has that size, a 29.5 ball will be used

- 1. National High School Federation rules will be followed with the few exceptions listed below.
- 2. Each player will be allowed a total of six (6) fouls before being disqualified.
- 3. All games will be played in two (2) fourteen (14) minute stop-clock halves.
- 4. The first overtime period will be 2 minutes. The second overtime period will be sudden death. The first team to score a point wins the game.
- 5. There will be a two (2) minute rest period between halves.
- 6. Teams will be allowed to call two (2) full time-outs and one (1) thirty second time-out during the regulation game.
- 7. There will be a minimum of a three (3) minute warm-up period between games.
- 8. All teams are expected to arrive for games **AT LEAST 45 MIN** prior to the scheduled start times. A five-minute grace period will be allowed before a forfeit is declared. IF any team is knowingly unable to make their scheduled games, they must notify the Tournament Director in advance.
- 9. Bonus (1 & 1) will begin on the 10th foul. However, there is no double bonus.
- 10. Running clock will start when a team is up 20 points in the second half only! If the lead is cut under 15, the clock will stop again.
- 11. If a team is down 20 points in the 2nd half under 2 minutes, the game will be called.

2024 - 2025 Rules: Grade-Based Division Policies - The following rules apply to student-athletes participating during the 2024–2025 academic year, effective December 1, 2024:

2033 / 10U / 4th Grade Division

- Eligibility: Players must be enrolled in the 4th grade and may be up to 11 years old but cannot turn 12 before June 1, 2025.
- Grade Exception: Players enrolled in the 5th grade who wish to compete in the 4th Grade Division must not turn 11 before August 1, 2025.

2032 / 11U / 5th Grade Division

- Eligibility: Players must be enrolled in the 5th grade and may be up to 12 years old but cannot turn 13 before June 1, 2025.
- Grade Exception: Players enrolled in the 6th grade who wish to compete in the 5th Grade Division must not turn 12 before August 1, 2025.

2031 / 12U / 6th Grade Division

- Eligibility: Players must be enrolled in the 6th grade and may be up to 13 years old but cannot turn 14 before June 1, 2025.
- Grade Exception: Players enrolled in the 7th grade who wish to compete in the 6th Grade Division must not turn 13 before August 1, 2025.

2030 / 13U / 7th Grade Division

- Eligibility: Players must be enrolled in the 7th grade and may be up to 14 years old but cannot turn 15 before June 1, 2025.
- Grade Exception: Players enrolled in the 8th grade who wish to compete in the 7th Grade Division must not turn 14 before August 1, 2025.

2029 / 14U / 8th Grade Division

- Eligibility: Players must be enrolled in the 8th grade and may be up to 15 years old but cannot turn 16 before June 1, 2025.
- Grade Exception: Players enrolled in the 9th grade who wish to compete in the 8th Grade Division must not turn 15 before August 1, 2025.

Player/Team Challenges

All teams are asked to bring at least two of the following items in the event of a challenge from another team, to the event.

- Official School Report Cards
- Copy Of Birth Certificate
- Valid Passport (Meets Age And Photo ID Requirements)
- Valid Driver's License Or Learner's Permit (Meets Age And Photo ID Requirements)
- Military ID Card (Meets Age And Photo Id Requirements)
- Dept. Of Motor Vehicles State Identification Card (Meets Age And Photo ID Requirements)
- <u>Home School Students: Home school students must have an official state</u> document confirming the student home school. Please see your state's Department of Education website for Home School Certification.

To challenge a player's eligibility, either the head coach or team director must do the following before the start of the game(Challenges will not be accepted during or after the game.)

- Present reasonable proof of the reason behind the challenge
- Pay \$100 to \$ontheradarhoops (cash app) or in cash to the tournament director or gym manager. If the challenge is valid, the full \$100 will be refunded back

If your team is under review due to a challenge, the tournament director or gym manager will look to review the report cards for the roster. If any document is missing or fails to provide the proper information, the player will be ineligible for the rest of the event.

Behavior Policies:

If a player is ejected he will not be eligible to play the next game.

If a coach is ejected, he will not be eligible to coach in the next game. ***All
